

### ON THE LOOKOUT



### → MORE TURNER/WHITE ←


I have heard from a few of you since the last newsletter on the Turner/White business transaction of 1904. It seems that after Turner acquired the White torch line, they continued with a dual nameplate for some period of time. I included a Turner/White nameplate rubbing in the last newsletter, THE TORCH, fourth quarter 1997, and in the article, I assumed that Turner would not have continued with the dual nameplate much after the acquisition. Wrong! Richard Giersee and Chuck Tobin sent in rubbings (see below) of a follow-up nameplate that has TURNER - WHITE embossed on the top, in lieu of the WHITE MFG. CO. that was embossed on my nameplate. Jim Maclean also sent in a photo and information on his WHITE/TURNER torch.

When you think about it, their marketing strategy concept is the same that is still in use today. , utilize the original manufacturer's name, in a consumer product merger or acquisition, for as long as possible to retain loyal purchasers. Turner was merely holding on to the White name for an extended period, to transition the loyal White users to Turner HOT BLAST torches. Even though there was no mention of the dual manufacturer reference in the 1904 letter written by the president of the White Mfg. Co., there may have been a follow-up letter covering some of the details, such as marketing and sales guidelines. Then again, they didn't have the same legal requirements back then that we are so accustom to today. Please, check your collections to see if there are other versions of the Turner - White nameplates and, if so, then send me a nameplate rubbing and we'll continue the saga. The story continues.....
